Out of the Mouth

Summary: We are created in the image of God. And, yet, we do not always act like it. Especially when we use our God-given ability to speak to give birth to negativity, to slander, to tear-down, and to abuse other people. We are God's mouthpieces to a fallen world—but what exactly is coming out of our mouths?

Actor Requirements: Minimum 3, no maximum. Actor 2 ideally would be male but Adam & Eve section is comedic so you could put a ball cap on a girl and then take it off for the following dramatic "eaten too much" section.

Characters: At times 1, 2, and 3 act as the Trinity but the consistent God character is number 1. 2 and 3 have more of the learner roles. This script calls for underscoring but it is optional—it could be live piano, canned CD, or humming from the actors. Use your imagination!

Note: The blocking is just a suggestion and not a requirement. Feel free to change the blocking completely to suit your needs.

Each time a word is **bolded**, this is the indication that the "word" motion should be acted out at the same time you say the bolded word. To act out the "word motion," take your right hand—grab the air, put hand to mouth (almost like your eating something), and then throw the air away in the same place your grabbed it. It is a quick out-in-out motion.

Actors begin in a line mid-stage: 2, 1, 3 (from stage right to left).

1: In the beginning

ALL: God spoke...

(quick paced, tight and together, same motions, and full of energy)

and clearly enjoying herself. Eve finds two dresses and asks Adam which one he likes best? At first he doesn't care but when she begs him to choose one, she tosses away the one he finally chooses and holds the other dress up to herself in the mirror, admiring the view. She sees the fruit out of the corner of her eye (fun music turns to Jaws theme) and she approaches and music stops when Eve picks the fruit. She eats with the "word" motion. Then she gives it to Adam and he eats with the "word" motion.

1:	All of us do many wrong things.

1:	(1 puts bit into 2's mouth and they move left and right together) By putting a bit into the mouth of a horse, we can turn the horse in different directions.	
3:	(3 pushes against 2 with her whole body but he doesn't budge) It takes strong winds to move a large sailing ship, (3 grabs 2's ear and 2 folds) but the captain uses only a small rudder to make it go in any direction.	
1:	Our tongues are small too, and yet they brag about big things.	

3:	It takes only a spark to start a forest fire!	
2:	Only you can prevent forest fires! (Like Smokey the Bear)	
1:	The tongue is like a spark. It is an evil power that dirties the rest of the body and sets a person's entire life on fire with flames that come from hell itself.	
2:	All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and sea creatures can be tamed and have been tamed. But our tongues get out of control. They are restless and evil, and always spreading deadly poison.
